In early June the Executive Committee voted an additional \$1200 to finish the trailer as Tom Sidenor had been ill and could not do the prep work.

Treasurer's report: Heinbach distributed the Treasurer's report as of 6/01/26, as received by chapter presidents.

Warehouse Manager Agenbroad reported that the trailer was finished and could be parked in public places to help advertise RVers of Idaho.

Legislative Representative Craig reported that there was a new state park being developed on a former ranch between Salmon and Challis. Parks and Rec Director Susan Buxton will speak to our group on Friday at lunch.

Chaplain Bruyette announced he would conduct church at 8:00 Sunday. Some of the buildings on the Elmore County Fair Grounds are in need of painting and pressure washing. Dave has volunteered us to do this as a community outreach project while we are here. He is also working on the Fair's pickup truck which quit running.

Old Business: Chapters were asked to report which charities will receive \$250 from RVers of Idaho. Time To Travel chose the Women's Center at the VA Hospital, the Backpack school program, the Meridian Foodbank and the Boise Rescue Mission. They will add TTT money to the RVers \$250 to give each charity \$150. Military Chapter would like to donate to the Suicide Survivors fund set up by the Sour Dough Chapter. Other chapters have not chosen charities.

Tetrault called for reports from the committees he set up at the Fall Rally.

Trailer: Agenbroad reported the trailer is finished and within budget.

Funds: Wyatt said the committee had met but had no recommendations.

Advertising: no committee members were present.

New Business: Bruyette would like to see money from the treasury used for more charitable projects, especially in the communities where we camp. He would like to have the RVers get involved in a project in Glenns Ferry for the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 pm.
